<p style="text-align: center;">BLS Treatment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assess circulation, airway, breathing, and responsiveness.• Oxygen as indicated.• Provide Spinal Motion Restriction as indicated or position of comfort as indicated.• Appropriately splint suspected fractures/instability as indicated.• Bandage wounds/control bleeding as indicated.• Head trauma, elevate head of spine board 15-20 degrees.
<p style="text-align: center;">ALS Treatment</p> <p>Current American Heart Association Guidelines concerning Emergency Cardiac Care assessments and interventions shall always take precedence over local protocols when there is a conflict concerning techniques of resuscitation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Advanced airway if indicated.• Normal Saline bolus. <p>For isolated extremity trauma, for pain:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Morphine Sulfate <p>For nausea / vomiting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ondansetron
<p style="text-align: center;">Base Hospital Contact Criteria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• For additional Morphine above maximum dose.
