

## 2.16 SHOCK

BLS Treatment
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Position of comfort.</li><li>• NPO.</li><li>• Oxygen as indicated.</li></ul>
ALS Treatment
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Establish IV/IO with <b>Normal Saline</b> TKO.</li><li>• If SBP &lt; 90 or signs of poor perfusion, <b>Normal Saline</b> fluid bolus.</li><li>• For suspected cardiogenic shock: <b>Dopamine</b>.</li></ul>
Comments
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Compensated shock:</b> Anxiety, agitation, disorientation, tachycardia, normal B/P, capillary refill normal to delayed, symptoms of allergic reaction, pallor, and/or diaphoresis.</li><li>• <b>Decompensated shock:</b> Decreased level of consciousness, tachycardia changing to bradycardia, hypotension, delayed capillary refill, cyanosis, and/or unequal central and distal pulses.</li><li>• Follow Protocol 2.02 Allergic Reaction/Anaphylaxis if patient has suspected anaphylaxis.</li></ul>
